Anne Peters, M.D., is Professor of Medicine and Clinical Scholar at the Keck School of Medicine of USC and Director of the USC Clinical Diabetes Programs. Dr. Peters earned her medical degree from the Pritzker School of Medicine at the University of Chicago and performed an internal medicine residency at Stanford University and an endocrinology fellowship at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center. She previously directed the clinical diabetes programs at Cedars-Sinai and UCLA.

She has been a primary investigator on over 40 grants, published over 250 articles, reviews, and abstracts and four books on diabetes. She has also spoken at over 400 programs throughout the US as well as internationally. She has served on many committees for the ADA, EASD, Endocrine Society and other organizations and plays a central role in developing national guidelines for diabetes care, serving on the American Diabetes Association (ADA)/European Association for the Study of Diabetes (EASD) Guidelines Committee for Management of Type 1 Diabetes. Dr. Peters consults for many entities, including the FDA, Optum Rx and CVS/Caremark to help guide the development and use of treatments for diabetes, and an influential advocate and policy advisor for new diabetes treatment guidelines and increased access to care.

Dr. Peters' passion is to advocate for diabetes care and access to medical care and technologies in Los Angeles' underserved population. She works with the L.A. County Department of Health Services on a county-wide diabetes program, and she established the Community Diabetes Initiatives Research Center (CDI) with Children's Hospital Los Angeles (CHLA). Dr. Peters received the American Diabetes Association (ADA) Outstanding Physician Clinician Award and the Bernardo Houssay Award from the National Minority Quality Forum for her work with the underserved.
